

English: In English we will be reading 'Orion and the Dark' by Emma Yarlett and 'The Rabbit, The Dark and The Biscuit Tin' by Nicola O'Bryne. Throughout this unit the children will be writing: character and setting descriptions; conversations; instructions; non-chronological reports and stories.

Maths: In Maths we will be continuing with addition and subtraction and then moving onto multiplication and division. The children should continue working on TTRS at home to improve their fluency with multiplications to 12x12.

Science: Science will be the driver for our topic 'Is the dark anything to be really afraid of?' We will be learning about light and electricity. The children will be learning where light comes from; how we see; how light from the sun can be dangerous; and how shadows are formed. When learning about electricity the children will be learning to make electrical circuits; which materials are conductors and which are insulators: and how switches work.

Topic:

Is the dark anything to be really afraid of?



Art and Design:

The children will be researching existing products and then designing and making lightboxes.

RE: The children will be learning about Christmas. The children will be exploring the symbolism of light. They will also be learning about the Jewish festival of Hanukkah.

Homework: Homework will be set every **Friday** and must be return the following **Wednesday**. This includes reading books which need to be returned to be changed. Children need to read their books and fill out their reading records. We encourage all parents to listen to their child read and to also sign the reading record to confirm the book has been read. Computing: The children will be learning how to keep our information private by protecting it with powerful passwords. We will also be learning to touch type to write for different audiences.

Music: The children will be learning to play the glockenspiel to music and will be creating their own compositions.

PE: The children will be developing their static balance and agility. We will also be learning to play team games.
