### **Primary School Application Forms**

Do you have a child due to start Reception in September 2017? Your application for a school place must be carried out online. The closing date for primary school applications is Sunday 15th January 2017. You still need to make an application online even if your child is currently in our Nursery. You will be informed of which school your child has been offered by email and you will receive this before 12 noon on 18th April 2017.

If you do not receive an email by 12 noon, please check for the email in your junk/spam folder before contacting the Admissions Team at Oldham Council (phone 0161 770 4213).

You will also be able to log back into your account. Please ensure that you have kept a note of your username, password, security question and answer to access your account.

The school office will not be able to inform you of which school your child has been offered.

### Attendance

The whole school attendance for WE 14/10/16 was 98.25%. This means that this week's attendance was above our target of 96.5%. Well done. Thank you for your continued support.

This week the attendance league table is as follows:

1st –Mrs Ali's class (Orange) with 100%

2nd – Mr Bennett's and Mrs Hayman's class (Lime) with 99.37%

3rd - Mrs Evans' class (Yellow) with 99.33%

Each school day is 6 hrs. This week 16.08 hours of education were lost due to appointments and 2.58 hours due to lateness. We need your help to continue to reduce these figures. You can help by making sure all routine opticians and dental appointments are made outside of school hours or in the school holidays and that your child attends school on time every day. If an appointment is unavoidable (e.g. hospital appointments) please ensure your child attends school before and after it- every minute of every day counts! Thank you.



## **Key Stage Assessments**

It may only be the start of the year but we need to remind parents that important assessments take place in May and June this year. Y6 will take the statutory KS2 SATs week beginning 8<sup>th</sup> May 2017 and all children must be in attendance for that week. Y2 also undertake KS1 SATs throughout May and Y1 have the Phonics Screening Check the week beginning 12<sup>th</sup> June 2017. Again these are a statutory requirement all children must complete.

If a child is persistently late, this can create gaps in their education and prevent them from reaching their full learning potential. It can also disrupt the classroom when lessons have already begun and cause unnecessary distress to the child that is late. Therefore, not only must a child attend school regularly, but they must not be late. If your child arrives at school on at least 10 occasions after the registration period and is recorded as late after registration, you may incur a Fixed Penalty Notice (fine).

With regard to absence, 96.5% is the expected level of attendance that St Anne's pupils should aim for. Persistent gaps in your child's education can have a serious impact on their educational attainment. It is a parent's legal responsibility to ensure the regular, full-time attendance of their children. Failing to do this could lead to legal proceedings from the LA and a Penalty Notice (fine) being issued. Parents do <u>not</u> have the legal right to take their child out of school on holiday during term time. Term-time holidays are no longer authorised and you will be issued a Penalty Notice by the Education Attendance Service and your child could lose their school place. Routine medical appointments such as routine opticians check up, dentist check ups etc. should not be taken during school time. Try to arrange such appointments in school holidays, or after school.

Attendance recorded at 96.5% - Excellent.

Attendance recorded at 95.1%-96.49% - Good

Attendance recorded at 94.24-95.09% - Average

Attendance recorded at 94.23% and below – Poor

Attendance recorded at 90% or below is classes as persistent absence

Please feel free to discuss any concerns with your child's attendance with a member of staff. There may be support available to help secure an improvement in a child's attendance and we will assist you where we can.
