English: We will reading 'Leather Shoe Charlie' by Gyeong—Hwa Kim and we will use the structure of the story to write our own innovated version. <u>Science:</u> In Science we will be consolidating our learning of Physics. During this unit, the children will be learning about light and how light travels, learning that darkness is the absence of light. We will also be developing our scientific skills including asking
